As membership lead, Ms. Hagberg is responsible for overseeing the recruitment, retention and growth of relationships with BCIU's member companies, building a foundation for long-term strategic partnerships. She utilizes member input to refine, ideate and expand BCIU's services and programs, and secures buy-in and financial support for initiatives across BCIU's business lines. Ms. Hagberg joined BCIU in 2008 as Program Officer for the Middle East and North Africa, and her portfolio gradually expanded to include South and Central Asia, Turkey, Japan and Korea. Andreas Schleicher

Director for the Directorate of Education and Skills

Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD)

Andreas Schleicher is Director for Education and Skills at the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD). He initiated and oversees the Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) and other international instruments that have created a global platform for policy-makers, researchers and educators across nations and cultures to innovate and transform educational policies and practices.

He has worked for over 20 years with ministers and education leaders around the world to improve quality and equity in education. Former U.S. Secretary of Education Arne Duncan said that Schleicher "understands the global issues and challenges as well as or better than anyone I've met, and he tells me the truth" (*The Atlantic,* July 11). Former UK Secretary of State Michael Gove called Schleicher "the most important man in English education" – even though he is German and lives in France.

Before joining the OECD, he was Director for Analysis at the International Association for Educational Achievement (IEA). He studied Physics in Germany and received a degree in Mathematics and Statistics in Australia. He is the recipient of numerous honours and awards, including the "Theodor Heuss" prize, awarded in the name of the first president of the Federal Republic of Germany for "exemplary democratic engagement". He holds an honorary Professorship at the University of Heidelberg.



Robin Shrode Chair

Robin is a teacher at heart with a focus on helping organizations improve so that each educator and student experiences teaching and learning in the most effective and efficient system possible. How we learn and what we learn is changing exponentially in the 21st century. We have the exciting opportunity to apply what we know about how this generation of students learns inside and outside the classroom and how we should fundamentally think differently about lesson design. On her journey to becoming an educational consultant Robin also carried the titles of classroom teacher, school counselor, and administrator of school improvement and professional development programs.

She has been awarded both Teacher of the Year and Counselor of the Year in her former district and education region in Irving, Texas. Being a part of the Texas Staff Development Council (currently Learning Forward TX) Board of Directors for three years (2004---2007) was a great growth experience for Robin. She collaborated with other board members to shape the face of professional learning in her home state as well as co--author the PLC Academy, a year-long academy that district cohorts would participate in to gain knowledge and skills in collaborative instructional planning and data analysis.

From 2001---2004 Robin served as a USDOE Practitioner Advisor, a small group of practicing educators across the nation, to serve as advisors to Small Learning Communities grant recipients and has personally led and sustained educational reform at the secondary level. In 2006, she co-founded The American Alliance for Innovative Schools, LLC with a business partner and later renamed the company "American Alliance for Innovative Systems, LLC" to broaden their work scope. Robin currently serves on the Executive Board of Directors of the National Career Academy Coalition (NCAC) where she is 2022 Chair-Elect.



Catherine Stihler Chief Executive Officer Creative Commons

Catherine Stihler OBE has been an international champion for openness as a legislator and practitioner for over 20 years.

Born in Scotland, Catherine was educated at St Andrews University, where she was awarded a Master of Arts (MA) with Honours in Geography and International Relations and a Master of Letters (MLitt) in International Security Studies. She also holds a Master of Business Administration degree from the Open University and an honorary Doctor of Letters (D.Litt.) from St Andrews University for her contributions as the 52nd Rector and for her public service.

She stood for election as a Member of the European Parliament for Scotland in 1999, representing the Labour Party. At the European Parliament she became one of Scotland's longest serving and most respected legislators.

Catherine was elected Vice-Chair of the European Parliament's Internal Market and Consumer Protection Committee, founded the Campaign for Parliamentary Reform and the parliament's All-Party Library Group, and was instrumental in securing graphic health warnings on cigarette packets across the EU.

In 2019, Catherine was awarded an OBE by Her Majesty the Queen in recognition of her services to politics. That same year, she stood down from the European Parliament to become the chief executive officer of the Open Knowledge Foundation. During her 18-month tenure at the Foundation, Catherine redefined its vision and mission to produce a new strategic direction, re-engage its global chapters and increase the worldwide profile of the organisation.

In August 2020, Catherine was appointed chief executive officer of Creative Commons, a non-profit organisation that helps overcome legal obstacles to the sharing of knowledge and creativity to address the world's pressing challenges.

She was selected to the Fellowship of Scotland's national academy, the Royal Society of Edinburgh (RSE) in 2022.

Anita Thomas is the Chair of the NGO Committee on Financing for Development, a Substantive Committee of the Conference of NGOs (CoNGO). She was elected to this role by the Committee for a third term in 2021. She also serves as the Convener of the NGO Coalition to End Violence and Harassment in the World of Work, a coalition convened by five NGO Committees (the NGO Committee on Financing of Development, NGO Committee on Status of Women, NGO Committee on Migration, and NGO Committee to Stop Trafficking in Persons) to advance ratification of ILO C-190.

She is the Main UN Representative for Women First International Fund at the UN, an NGO in ECOSOC Consultative Status, that provides grants for the economic empowerment of women and girls globally. She served as the main representative and alternate representative of the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts to the UN for over ten years. Her professional experience, spanning over twenty years with both domestic and international NGOs, includes management roles with the Conference of NGOs, Sam Schmidt Paralysis Foundation, and consultant roles in project management, grants management, and finance.

She holds an M.S. in Finance from the Simon School of Business, University of Rochester, a MPAP from the Bloustein School of Public Policy, Rutgers University, and an M.A. Economics from Madras Christian College, India. She is a Fellow of the Eagleton Institute of Politics, Rutgers University.

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
